This year's fair theme is "Tractor Pulling". **Thursday, September 16, 2021**, is designated as Agricultural Education Day at the Tunbridge World's Fair. All ages and grade levels, K-12, are welcome to attend this day. If you're planning to attend, here are more details as you get ready for your school's field trip:

School students and their chaperones will be accepted for free admission from **8AM - 10AM** on **September 16, 2021**. The chaperone free admission ratio is **one adult per 2 to 5 students**. All other adults will be charged general admission.

Please pre-register your school group by email so we can plan for approximate numbers. The form is attached, and also available on our website.

Please identify students and chaperones with the name of their school and phone number. The Orange County Sherriff's department will supply name tags for groups again this year. If you pre-order these at 802-685-4875, they will have them ready at your arrival.

All school groups and busses must enter at **Gate 4** at the south end of the fairgrounds. Ambassadors will greet the busses, check your registration, hand out maps and schedules, and answer questions. ***Please know in advance a head count of students on your bus!** Once students have disembarked, busses will be directed to designated parking. Small private and home schools must also use **Gate 4** to enter, but please use general parking.

For everyone's safety while busses are driving in and parking, any chaperones driving separately from the bus please meet their school group AT THE GATE. Please do not meet students at their bus.

See enclosed map for recommendations on where your age group should start their Tunbridge Fair adventure. Please consider this as it helps with foot traffic flow around the fairgrounds.

Rides and the mid-way will not operate during Ag Education hours. Concessions will open at noon.

At **11AM** we will provide milk, donated by Booth Brothers, for students' lunches at the grandstand.
