Log Cabin Museum from 9 – 11AM

Observe and ask questions about: Butter churning, candle dipping, hearth cooking, spinning, quilting, rug making and more! Visit the old general store and post office. Also check out the Civil War re-enactors, cannon, tents and musket firing.
